


90-90-90 Treatment Target TOWARD ENDING AIDS IN VIET NAM

AN AMBITIOUS NEW TARGET

As the world nears the deadline for both the Millennium Development Goals and the targets and commitments in the 2011 Political Declaration on HIV and AIDS, consensus is building around a final, ambitious target that will drive progress towards the concluding chapter of the AIDS epidemic:

- By 2020, 90% of all people living with HIV will know their HIV status.
- By 2020, 90% of all people with diagnosed HIV infection will receive sustained antiretroviral therapy.
- By 2020, 90% of all people receiving antiretroviral therapy will have durable viral suppression.


Viet Nam is collaborating with its international partners to reach this new target.



STATUS

- Awareness of HIV is still low and stigma and discrimination remain significant barriers to HIV services.
- HIV testing coverage and access to testing are limited.
- HIV treatment coverage is limited.
- Many people who know they are living with HIV start antiretroviral treatment very late.
- Resources for the HIV response remain insufficient and unsustainable.


GAPS



SOLUTIONS

- Strengthen political leadership and commitment at all level of the Government.
- Ensure sufficient investment for the response to HIV.
- Prioritize interventions for key populations at higher risk of HIV infection.
- Scale up HIV counselling and testing.
- Scale up and improve quality of HIV treatment, especially immediate treatment for key populations.

THREE INVESTMENT SCENARIOS



Scenario 1 - **Business as usual:** Maintaining the current HIV response will see the rate of new HIV infections level out at about 14,000 per year.

Scenario 2- Failure to invest: If donors leave too fast and Viet Nam does not invest additional resources, the failure to invest will lead to a rapid expansion of the HIV epidemic, with annual new infections soaring to over 20,000 by 2030.

Scenario 3 – **Ending AIDS:** Going for 90-90-90 will reduce new HIV infections to 2,720 cases by 2020 and to 950 cases by 2030, effectively ending AIDS as a public health threat in Viet Nam.
